

This year we have introduced a daily circle. We ask the young people and staff to step into the circle as a way of saying they are ready to participate and be part of the community. It is also a time that we can greet each other, share messages, and start the day on a positive note. Thank you to all of our families that are encouraging our young

people to take an active part of this daily. A by-product of coming together every day is that we are listening to more young people voices as well as starting the day with a laugh.



BUSES

Our school bus runs are way of ensuring that getting to school is not a barrier for attending school. Our school bus runs are popular. Each run is full, but we are noticing that many of the young people are not catching their designated bus on a regular basis. This is a concern for us as we are sending staff out to do the daily bus runs with only one or two young people on the bus. We have had times where there were no young people on the bus run at all. This is time and money that we don't have the luxury of wasting. Each day requires 8 staff members for at least an hour of their time to implement these twice daily bus runs. We will be contacting families of the young people who currently have a spot on the bus but are not catching the bus consistently. As mentioned there is a huge demand and there are other young people awaiting a space to open up.

We thank you for your ongoing support of your young person and our school community. As the old saying goes, it takes a village, and we have enjoyed sharing our Term One achievements with you, particularly our Welcome BBQ at the beginning of the term and our Celebration of Learning Day for the last day of Term. Wishing you a very safe and happy Easter break with your family and friends, and we look forward to seeing you all for Term Two.

Senior Transitions - White Card Notice

IFLC would like to share some important updates regarding the General Construction Induction Training (GCIT), commonly known as the White Card requirement, particularly for Queensland.

As of February 2023, there have been significant changes to the White Card training regulations in QLD. It has come to our attention that some of our students have recently completed courses that are no longer approved to issue White Cards. This unfortunate situation has led to financial losses for some students and has prevented them from accessing opportunities to work on construction sites.

To prevent any further inconveniences, it's crucial that students and their families verify the training organisation's accreditation before enrolling in any White Card courses. Here are some key points to consider:

- Ensure that the training provider offers either CPCCWHS1001 or CPCWHS1001 units. To obtain accreditation for these units, students will need to provide their Unique Student Identifier (USI) number.
- The course must run for a minimum of 4.5 hours face-to-face. While this can be completed either online or in a classroom setting, pre-recorded sessions will not meet the accreditation requirements.

Should you have any questions or require assistance in selecting an appropriate course, please do not hesitate to reach out to Sian the Skills Training and Transitions Officer. Sian is here to support students and families through this process.

Exciting news for the upcoming Term 2! We are thrilled to announce that students will have the opportunity to complete their White Card training through IFLC, completely free of charge. This onsite training will be conducted with the support of IFLC staff, ensuring a smooth and enriching learning experience for all participants. More information will be provided in Term 2 with how students can express their interest in attending.


