

### A message from Luke the Associate Head of Campus.



As we come to the end of Term 1, we are thrilled to have welcomed many new staff members and young people into our community. Learning to navigate our unique environment involves working flexibly, negotiating solutions with one another, and adhering to our four guiding principles. Together, we have built a strong foundation for collaboration and success this term. While there have been ups and downs, there has always been a willingness to work through challenges together.

There have been many changes and additions to our curriculum offerings this year with the introduction of electives across the school. This is particularly beneficial for our senior classes, providing more course offerings and opportunities for young people to work towards their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). Thank you to all young people embracing these new programs.

Supporting our young people effectively means ensuring our staff have the skills and knowledge to provide the best possible guidance. A key focus this term has been on Collaborative Problem Solving (CPS), which underpins how we engage with our young people. CPS emphasises empathy, shared understanding, and working together to find sustainable solutions. Many staff members are undergoing professional learning in this approach, with several progressing to Tier 2 training. This ongoing upskilling reflects our commitment to providing a supportive and solutions-focused environment.

Cyclone Alfred made its presence known, bringing heavy rains and temporary school closures. We sincerely appreciate the patience and cooperation of our entire community during this time. Your flexibility and resilience ensured that we could navigate the disruptions smoothly and return to our learning environment with minimal impact.

A final note about our buses: We are proud to offer transport services to some of our young people, a significant undertaking. Each day, our buses cover approximately 280 km, amounting to an incredible 11,200 km and over 140 hours of travel this term alone! In addition, regular outings further extend this mileage. Maintaining these buses is crucial, and we continue to emphasise the importance of safe and respectful travel habits among our young people. A huge thank you to our drivers and staff who make this essential service possible and to the young people who hold one another to account.

We look forward to a productive and enriching Term 2 ahead, where we continue learning, growing, and working together as a strong and supportive community.

### Junior Lockyer Learning Hub



What an awesome term we have had in Lockyer. From a group of young people who didn't even know each other to the group that is able to have clever conversations and work together to solve problems and make plans, we have grown as a learning group. We are thrilled to announce the introduction of new electives for our Year 11 and 12 students, and Junior Workshop for our 9 and 10s. This new initiative is designed to expand skills and provide hands-on learning opportunities. It also gives students a chance to explore their passions but also equip them with valuable skills for their future careers.

Years 11 & 12: Practical Electives for Industry Readiness

Starting this year, Years 11 and 12 students can choose from three engaging electives:

- · Furnishings: In this course, students will explore the world of interior design, furniture making, and soft furnishings. From hands-on woodworking to understanding design principles, this elective helps students build skills they can use in various creative industries.
- · Automotive Skills: This elective offers students the chance to work on cars, from basic maintenance to more advanced repairs. Perfect for those interested in mechanics or the automotive industry, this course prepares students for real-world tasks and opens doors to apprenticeships and career opportunities.
- · Industry Skills: This course focuses on essential skills needed in various industries, including safety practices, project management, and technical skills that students can apply in real-world work environments.

Students doing Furnishings will be utilising the workshop at Inala Flexi school, which we are currently designing and fitting out with equipment. The Automotive students will be setting up shop at Albert Park Flexi School.

Years 9 & 10: Junior Workshop

For our Years 9 and 10 students, the Junior Workshop provides a fantastic opportunity to develop practical skills in a variety of areas. This hands-on program introduces students to the basics of carpentry, giving them a taste of what they might pursue in the future. These students will be working at Ipswich.
